Who We Are:

Genocide Watch is an international, nonprofit organization that uses the Ten Stages of Genocide model to analyze, prevent, stop, and punish genocide.

Genocide Watch is looking for an Education and Timestream Creator Intern to join the team. Given the nature of this role's work, and the current COVID-19 pandemic, this internship position can be completed remotely.

Who You Are:

You are a champion for human rights and are passionate about genocide prevention. You recognize the importance of education and research in Genocide Watch's work. You are a strong independent worker and effective team player who enjoys collaborating with multiple stakeholders. You know how to foster relationships. You thrive in fast paced environments while working on multiple projects at a time. You have excellent research, writing, and analytical skills, in addition to a sharp attention to detail. You are a strong communicator who provides constructive feedback to contribute to the team.

This position requires a time commitment between 16-20 hours per week and will be conducted virtually.

What You'll Learn:

As an Education and Timestream Creator Intern, you will have the opportunity to see how a nonprofit organization supports its research, education, legal, and advocacy work. You will conduct open-source research on historical, developing, and ongoing genocides. Using your findings, you will create a chronological timeline and presentation of the subject to be published on the Genocide Watch website and utilized in classrooms worldwide.

What You'll Do:

- Within a group or individually, conduct in-depth, open-source research on historical, developing, or ongoing cases of genocide.
- Analyze and synthesize research from a variety of strong, credible sources for each Timestream event.
- Develop individual events making up a larger timeline of events to explain how genocidal processes unfold.
- Structure each Timestream in a way that makes complex genocidal processes and periods of history approachable and accessible to students as an effective educational resource.

Compensation

This is an unpaid, virtual internship opportunity. Applicants are encouraged to seek outside funding sources, including but not limited to grants, stipends, or fellowships. We will gladly assist with this process as needed. Some students may also receive credit for work completed at Genocide Watch through their academic program(s).
